

Perspective Scenarios

Choose students to role play the following scenarios. Talk about the feelings and perspectives of the different people in each scenario.

1	Your best friend has started playing with someone else at recess. Whenever you ask to join their games, they tell you they already have enough people in the game.
2	You and two other friends are making a group poster in art class. You want to use markers to add color but the others want to use paint.
3	Your regular lunch table is full and the only other open seat in the school cafeteria is at a table with a new kid in school that you have never talked to before.
4	You and your classmates are studying a novel. Your teacher asked you to read aloud a passage you were assigned to study the night before. You are not prepared to read the passage.
5	Your family is going out to eat for dinner. Your sister wants to go one restaurant and you want to go to another. Your dad says that if you can't agree on a restaurant then you will just stay home.
6	Sally is always late for school and you often make fun of her with your friends. Your teacher announced this morning that Sally is absent because her little sister is in the hospital with cancer.
7	The old man who lives next door always stands and stares at you from his front window when you walk by his house. One day you decide to stick your tongue out and scream as you run past him. When you ask your mom why he is so grumpy she tells you that his wife recently died.
